Hudson actually has a girlfriend though, (sorry ladies) but Hudson has wished us to not go further into the matter.

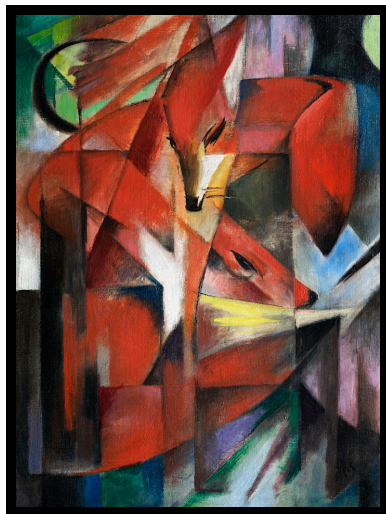
We remember him in his finest hour as he led us in the charge up Trailridge hill and we fought against the goobers from Westridge, I recall his battle speech.

Q: What were your parents like?

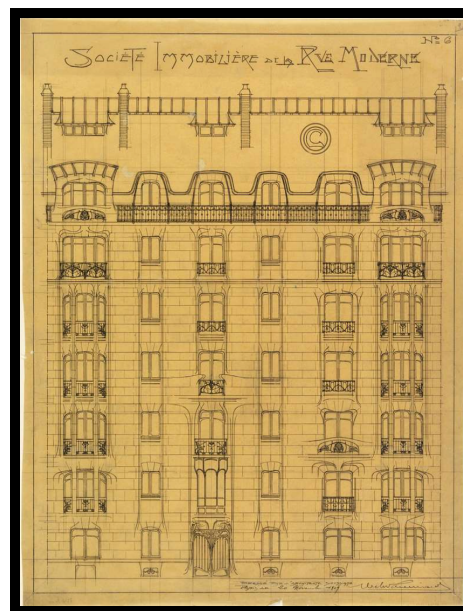
A: Never met them
